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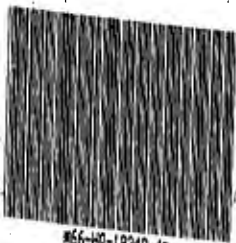

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

NARS Advisory Council members felt that the permanent retention of [redacted] would be unacceptable. An explanation of past reluctance to turn over census records to NARS was presented by members of the NARS Advisory Council and they indicated that it was agreed that census records would be permanently transferred to NARS 72 years after the date of the pertinent census, since this time frame covered the general life expectancy of those individuals participating in the census. Members of the NARS Advisory Council attempted to draw an analogy between the sensitivity of information appearing in census records and the sensitivity of information appearing in [redacted]. Their analogy was strongly rejected by Records Management Division (RMD) personnel and it was pointed out that, while census records may contain embarrassing information concerning the individual furnishing information to the census taker, this information could not be equated with the degree of danger to [redacted] which would result from the disclosure of [redacted] and specifics of information furnished during his or her tenure as [redacted].

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It was agreed that further discussions with NARS and RMD personnel would be held regarding this issue.

Under the authority of the Records Disposal Act (44 USC, Chapter 33), as recognized by the exemptions listed in the Privacy Act (5 USC 552a(b)(6)), the Administrator of the General Services Administration or his designee is authorized to examine agency records to determine whether they have sufficient historical or other value to warrant continued preservation. The Administrator of General Services has delegated this authority to the Archivist of the United States (GSA Delegations of Authority Manual, Chapter 8, National Archives and Records Service, Paragraph 2). There are no restraints on this authority.

Accordingly, I have designated the non-government experts on the attached list to assist the National Archives and Records Service in evaluating FBI records to determine which records have sufficient historical or other value to merit continued preservation.

[redacted] notes in his letter that "the authority of the Records Disposal Act (44 U.S. Code, Chapter 33), as recognized by the exemptions (sic) listed in the Privacy Act (5 U.S. Code 552a (b)(6)), the Administrator of General Services Administration or his designee is authorized to examine agency records to determine whether they have sufficient historical or other value to warrant continued preservation." [redacted] indicates that the "Administrator of General Services has delegated this authority to the Archivist of the United States (GSA Delegations of Authority Manual, Chapter 8, National Archives and Records Service, Paragraph 2)." According to [redacted] "there are no restraints on this authority."

Finzel, Records Management Division.

The following information is provided in accordance with Associate Deputy Attorney General [redacted] request to Mr. Finzel:

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In connection with the civil suit "American Friends Service Committee, et al., v. William H. Webster," civil action number 79-1655, U.S. District Court, Washington, D.C., NARS has been acting under orders of the Court to conduct an appraisal of records of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). NARS reviewed a number of FBI Headquarters, field office and Legal Attache Office investigative and administrative files in order to appraise these records to develop retention schedules. NARS has appointed nine nongovernmental experts who were identified in [redacted] letter to Deputy Attorney General Schmults, referred to above. These nongovernmental experts were appointed in order to review the retention plan developed by NARS for FBI records. NARS desires that these nongovernmental experts review a limited number (six to ten) of FBI Headquarters files, containing nonclassified material, that had previously been appraised by NARS archivists in order to

verify and authenticate the methodology utilized by the NARS appraisers. According to NARS, the benefit in permitting access to FBI Headquarters files to these nongovernmental experts would be to enable them to subsequently attest that they had verified the methodology and procedures utilized by the NARS appraisers in developing the retention plan for FBI records.

In informal discussions with NARS, the restrictions of access to FBI records, as defined by the Privacy Act (Title 5, U.S. Code, Section 552a) were raised. NARS advised that Subsection (b)(6) appears to provide the legal basis for access to FBI records by the nongovernmental experts appointed by NARS in that the Archivist of the United States, through the delegated authority of the Administrator of the General Services Administration, would designate these nongovernmental experts as "designees" in order to determine whether FBI records have sufficient historical or other value to warrant continued preservation by the U. S. Government. There appears to be some question as to whether such designation by the Archivist of nongovernmental experts appointed by NARS is valid. Of course, the FBI would defer to your decision in this regard.

If these nongovernmental experts are determined to be "designees" pursuant to Subsection (b)(6) of the Privacy Act and are permitted to review FBI files, it is requested that NARS ensure that these consultants agree to abide by the nondisclosure provisions of the Privacy Act. You may also wish to seek the approval of Judge Harold H. Greene to permit these nongovernmental experts to review FBI files and to insure they are bound by the nondisclosure provisions of the Privacy Act.

SYNOPSIS AND DETAILS:

I. GENERAL BACKGROUND

The FBI has been enjoined from the destruction of administrative and investigative files, as well as other records, including documentary evidence, since 1/10/80, as a result of an Opinion and Order issued by U.S. District Judge Harold H. Greene in the civil matter "American Friends Service Committee, et. al., v. William H. Webster, et. al., Civil Action Number 79-1655," U.S. District Court, Washington, D.C. The plaintiffs in the aforementioned civil suit maintain that FBI records should be retained permanently, due to their unique historical and archival value. In Judge Greene's 1/10/80 Order and Opinion, supra, he instructed that NARS conduct an extensive detailed review of all FBI records in order to develop a retention plan for submission to the FBI for review. Judge Greene ordered that after the review of the proposed NARS retention plan, the FBI develop disposition schedules for submission to NARS and after review and comment by NARS, he instructed that the NARS retention plan and FBI disposition schedules be submitted to the Court for review and approval. NARS began an extensive review of FBIHQ, field and Legat files in February, 1981, and completed this review in early September, 1981. During the course of the NARS appraisal, NARS archivists, accompanied by senior RMD analysts, visited eight FBI field offices and the FBI Academy. According to NARS, their appraisal of FBI records was the most extensive, comprehensive undertaking ever conducted of Government records. The expenditure of both FBI and NARS personnel and material resources has been astronomical. NARS was required to detail 18 senior archivists from other duties to the FBI Appraisal Project and the Deputy Director of Presidential Libraries was designated the Director of the FBI Appraisal Project. NARS estimates to date that approximately [redacted] in personnel and material expenses has been dedicated to the FBI Appraisal Project. As of 9/25/81, [redacted] FBI employees directly participated in the NARS Appraisal Project at a cost totaling [redacted]

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II. CURRENT STATUS - COURT-ORDERED DEADLINES

Judge Greene ordered NARS to submit a comprehensive retention plan to the FBI by 9/28/81. NARS did submit a draft of their proposed retention plan for FBI records, which contained approximately 600 pages. A large portion of the plan

was incomplete when submitted on 9/28/81, and major portions were submitted in rough draft, handwritten form. Since 9/28/81, NARS submitted revisions to the proposed retention plan on 10/8/81, 10/9/81, 10/11/81, 10/12/81 and 10/13/81. According to NARS, the proposed retention plan for FBI records is the most complicated, difficult plan ever promulgated by that agency. Judge Greene ordered the FBI to review the NARS retention plan; develop corresponding disposition schedules and submit same to NARS by COB 10/16/81. After review and comment by NARS, the FBI disposition schedules and the NARS retention plan must be submitted to Judge Greene by 11/9/81, at which time the plaintiffs will be given an opportunity to review the material and present their comments to the Court.

III. SUMMARY OF NARS PROPOSED RETENTION PLAN

A. General destruction plan for field, Legat and FBIHQ files.

1. Auxiliary Office (AO) field office files may be destroyed six months after the date of the last relevant communication.
2. Criminal Office of Origin (OO) field and Legat files may be destroyed 10 years after the case has been closed or 10 years after the last relevant communication, whichever is later. The destruction plan for FBIHQ criminal files is the same. Security OO field and Legat files may be destroyed 20 years after the case has been closed or 20 years after the last relevant communication, whichever is later. The destruction plan for FBIHQ security files is the same. Applicant field and Legat files may be destroyed 20 years after the case has been closed or 20 years after the last relevant communication, whichever is later. The destruction plan for FBIHQ applicant files is the same. FBIHQ informant files are to be permanently retained.

B. Permanent Retention Plan.

NARS identified specific categories of records which must be permanently retained by the field, Legats and FBIHQ. Categories of such records to be permanently retained are listed below:

1. Internal FBI operations and procedures.
2. FBI relations with the Department of Justice, the Federal judiciary, other Federal investigative agencies, the White House, Congress, foreign governments, state and local law enforcement organizations and other significant organizations.
3. FBI investigative policies and techniques.
4. FBI public relations activities.
5. Illegal activity, including "Do Not File" memoranda maintained at Headquarters, the Chicago Office and the New York Office.
6. The role of the FBI Director and his close associates, including former Director Hoover's "OC" files, the Nichols file, the Tolson file and Executive Conference minutes.
7. Official personnel folders limited to employees who attained the position of SAC (Section Chief) or above, recipients of the Attorney General's Award, the Rockefeller Public Service Award and Special Agents killed in the line of duty or those who received wide media attention in connection with alleged wrong doings.
8. Information of historical value which has specifically been identified by NARS, files on individuals who held a high public office, political leaders, labor leaders, prominent businessmen, members of an extremist group, leaders of professional associations, files on advocacy groups and ethnic association files on major cultural or intellectual figures, notorious criminals, an established asset, a significant foreign national who was engaged in intelligence activities for foreign elements.

9. A U.S. or foreign political party, an extremist group, labor organization, religious group, major legitimate businesses, a business allegedly controlled by or involved in organized crime, a special interest group, a major athletic, fraternal or social club, a Government agency or institution, a school or college or any other major organization.
10. Files dealing with events, including, but not limited to, civil disturbances, demonstrations and notorious crimes, including espionage, labor management disputes, major local causes, rallies, conventions and other public meetings. Files related to social and economic conditions, including, but not limited to, race relations and ethnic patterns, sexual mores, occupational patterns, labor relations, drugs and alcohol use, Government regulatory activities, family, political trends, business cycles and trends in criminal activities, as well as cultural and intellectual trends.
11. Specified files in the 214 FBI administrative and investigative classifications that have been judged to have informational and historical value.
12. Exceptional cases. Files that document FBI activities associated with a significant individual, event, organization, a precedent setting program and unusual investigative technique or a landmark case.
13. All files dealing with FBI specials, designated major cases and those files already designated by field offices as historical or files already designated by FBIHQ as historical.
14. Cases mentioned in annual reports of the FBI.
15. Cases mentioned in FBI testimony before Committees of Congress.

16. Cases accepted by the Supreme Court that involve FBI investigative activity.
17. All control files other than "O" files.
18. All cases containing a code word caption.
19. All cases which are maintained entirely in the FBIHQ Special File Room.
20. Files related to the Ten Most Wanted Program.
21. All "OO" files.
22. All FBI cases that have one or more newspaper clipping files.

In addition, NARS proposed that in the majority of administrative and investigative classifications, a percentage of the total file population at FBIHQ and in the field be permanently preserved as a systematic sampling. Each administrative and investigative classification has been addressed individually by NARS with further breakdowns by administrative and investigative files in obsolete classifications, classifications created after 1977, classifications created prior to 1978, and finally classifications created after 1978. It is pointed out that NARS took note of FBI report writing modifications in 1977 and 1978, which, in the opinion of NARS, weakened the completeness, accuracy and retrievability of administrative and investigative matters at FBIHQ.

C. Transfer (Accession Plan).

NARS proposed that field office, Legat and FBIHQ files identified in the proposed retention plan as having permanent value should be transferred to NARS 30 years after the date of the last relevant communication or document appearing in the file. NARS proposed that all FBI records identified by NARS as having permanent value, which were

created prior to 1951, be immediately transferred to the custody of NARS. Thereafter, NARS proposed that arrangements be made for the review of FBI files each 10 years, beginning in 1991, for the purpose of transferring these records to NARS.

Once FBI administrative and investigative files designated for permanent retention are transferred to NARS, they are no longer the property of the FBI and the maintenance, control and access to these files by the public (scholars, researchers, news media, etc.) becomes the exclusive responsibility of NARS. The release of information contained in FBI files permanently transferred to NARS is governed by the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Privacy Acts (FOI/PA); however, NARS has the exclusive responsibility in applying FOI/PA exemptions. The FBI has never transferred any substantial amount of administrative or investigative files to NARS. In the past, the FBI has transferred certain administrative and identification files, the and "Old German" (World War I era files), "Mexican" files, "Bureau Section" files, files related to miscellaneous investigations conducted by the Bureau of Investigation from 1914 through 1921, and the original documents of Dr. Heinrich F. Albert, German Commercial Attache in New York City during World War I.

IV. IDENTIFICATION OF ISSUES AND THE FBI'S PROPOSED DISPOSITION AND TRANSFER SCHEDULES

A. FBI's General Disposition Schedules

1. We will propose that AO field files be retained one year instead of the six months recommended by NARS.
2. We will propose that OO criminal field files be retained for 10 years as NARS has recommended. With the exception of files to be retained permanently as part of the systematic sampling process, we will recommend that Legat criminal files be retained for 5 years. We will emphasize the critical security and space considerations which exist in our foreign offices. We will propose that FBIHQ criminal files be retained for 20 years prior to consideration for destruction instead of 10 years recommended by NARS.

3. We will propose that OO security field files be destroyed after 20 years as NARS has recommended. However, for reasons cited in Part IV A(2), we will propose that, with the exception of files to be permanently retained as part of the systematic sampling process, Legat security files be retained for 10 years. We will propose that FBIHQ security files be retained for 30 years instead of the 20 years that NARS recommended.
4. With the exception of files to be retained permanently as part of the systematic sampling process, we will propose that applicant field and Legat files become eligible for destruction after one year, inasmuch as FBIHQ is OO in all applicant matters. We will propose that applicant FBIHQ files be considered for destruction after 30 years instead of the 20 years recommended by NARS.
5. We will recommend that field and Legat informant files be retained for 30 years prior to consideration for destruction instead of the 10 year destruction for criminal informant files and 20 year destruction for security informant files recommended by NARS. We will agree with NARS that FBIHQ informant files be retained permanently.

It is recognized that our proposals are for longer retention of administrative and investigative files than recommended by NARS. However, experience has demonstrated that these files should be retained for a longer period in order to satisfy our administrative and investigative needs. A recent RMD survey of all SACs established that the field also desires longer retention periods and our recommendations for the field conform to the wishes of the majority of the SACs.

B. Permanent Retention Plan

While permitting meaningful destruction, the NARS proposed retention plan requires the permanent retention of a volume of FBIHQ, field and Legat files. The obvious consideration of NARS in designating specific categories of

files to be permanently retained is to insure that files relating to historical events or matters of public interest are preserved. Generally, we have no objection to the categories of files designated by NARS for permanent retention, with the exception of those categories of files which would be difficult, if not impossible, to identify. These categories involve cases where FBI testimony before committees of Congress is mentioned; cases accepted by the Supreme Court that involve FBI investigative activities and those cases retained in their entirety in the FBIHQ Special File Room. These issues will be handled with NARS by RMD separately.

C. Transfer (Accession Plan)

The NARS proposal that files identified as having permanent historical or archival value be transferred to NARS after 30 years is unacceptable. The basic objection in furnishing such files to NARS after they have been closed for 30 years is that they may reveal sensitive investigative techniques and methods, as well as the true identity of FBI assets and/or informants. Many of these files still contain classifiable information which is not so identified or marked due to lack of formal classification procedures when the records were created. We will propose that FBI files designated for permanent retention due to their historical or archival value not be turned over to NARS until the case has been closed for 75 years or 75 years after the date of the last relevant communication, whichever is later. We feel this time frame will guarantee that no sensitive investigative techniques, sources, methods, assets or informants are prematurely disclosed to the public or otherwise compromised. Included in the NARS retention plan for transfer or accession of files to NARS are our asset and informant files. For obvious security reasons, as well as the disastrous chilling effect that would result when it became public knowledge that FBI asset and informant files were being turned over to NARS after 30 years, we will propose that all FBI asset and informant files be permanently retained by the FBI and not transferred to NARS.

V. GENERAL COMMENTS AND CONCLUSIONS

Present day records management concepts dictate that FBIHQ cannot retain administrative and investigative files in perpetuity as we have done thus far. We are literally bursting at the seams at FBIHQ from the accumulation of files dating from the 1920s. FBIHQ files must be destroyed in a reasoned, orderly fashion, always bearing in mind the need to retain certain records for our administrative and investigative needs. While requiring the retention of more files than originally envisioned, the NARS proposed retention plan provides us with the means to carry out meaningful destruction at FBIHQ and in the field. There is tremendous pressure being exerted by historians, researchers, scholars and special interest groups that the FBI permanently retain all records due to the unique role carried out by the FBI in our nation's history. Congress has also recently expressed an interest in insuring that the FBI not destroy certain categories of domestic security and loyalty investigative files. The methodology devised by NARS in developing their proposed retention plan hopefully will neutralize this pressure and allow us to begin a meaningful destruction program after consideration by the Court.

For a variety of reasons, past RMD officials had hoped to resolve the problem of the vast accumulation of records at FBIHQ by a liberal, widespread across-the-board destruction program of FBIHQ and field records. The current civil suit in which we find ourselves involved was a direct result of protests from various sectors to this proposed widespread destruction program.

RMD, since the inception of the American Friends Service Committee civil suit recognized that wholesale destruction of FBIHQ records would never become a reality. Appropriate long-range planning has been formulated to provide for a comprehensive micrographic program to reduce hard copy records which must be permanently retained to microfilm or microfiche. In addition, alternate storage and retrieval systems have been designed to reduce the space required to house records which must be permanently retained at FBIHQ until the hard copy records can be reduced to microfilm or microfiche. RMD hopes to apply these alternate storage and retention programs early in FY 1982. The Administrative Services Division has been working closely with RMD to accomplish this objective. RMD will formulate plans to retire field and Legat records which must be permanently retained to FBIHQ where they will be stored in conjunction

with the corresponding FBIHQ file until transfer to NARS after 75 years. RMD is attempting to work out an arrangement with NARS to temporarily house FBIHQ and field records in secure classified repositories at NARS' Federal Records Centers until they become eligible for permanent transfer after 75 years.

VI. SPECIFIC QUESTIONS TO BE RESOLVED AT THE 10/14/81
MEETING BETWEEN RMD REPRESENTATIVES AND
REPRESENTATIVES OF OTHER FBIHQ DIVISIONS

1. Is the general disposition program for FBIHQ, field and Legat files, outlined in Part IV A, acceptable? If not, provide details of objections and an alternate plan with justification.

2. Is the permanent retention plan for FBIHQ, field and Legat records, outlined in Part IV B, acceptable? If not, provide details of objections and present an alternate plan with justification.

3. Is the transfer (accession) plan outlined in Part IV C, acceptable? If not, provide details of objections and an alternative plan with justification.

As noted previously, we must meet a Court-imposed deadline for the submission of our disposition schedules to NARS by COB 10/16/81. The cooperation of other FBIHQ divisions is appreciated.

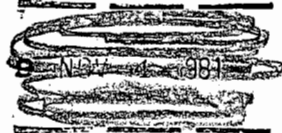

Neutrality Matters

Historical Synopsis:

Established in June of 1940, this classification covers investigations of violations of neutrality statutes. The Neutrality Acts declare illegal such actions as conspiracy to injure the property of a foreign government, enlisting in a foreign service, organizing a military expedition from the U.S. against a country with which the U.S. is at peace, and arming vessels of any country to commit hostilities against a country with which the United States is at peace. The Munitions Control Act, also known as the Export Control Act, requires the licensing of all persons engaged in the manufacture, importation of arts, ammunition, or implements of war. (u)

The FBI shares investigative responsibility for some violations in this classification with the U.S. Customs Service, Department of Treasury. In 1955 the two agencies entered into an agreement whereby the Bureau had primary investigative responsibility for neutrality acts and the Customs Service investigated violations of the Munitions Control Act. However, if Customs determined in the course of its investigation facts which involve a conspiracy of major proportions against a foreign government, Customs may request the FBI to assume investigation. Because violations in this classification have international ramifications and have increasingly become terroristic in nature, other agencies, such as the Department of Justice, Department of State, the National Security Council, and the Secret Service have expressed a continuing interest in investigations in this classification. There is also communication and cooperation with the [redacted] in some neutrality matters. (u)

Volume:

There are 2478 cases in Headquarters totalling 45 cubic feet of records. No case files have been microfilmed. There are 69 multi-section cases with an average of 3 sections per case. The pattern of case openings since 1945 has been erratic: 225 cases in 1948, but figures dropped steadily to a low of 19 in 1952 before climbing again in the late 1950's to more than 60. They dropped again in the late 1960's and early 1970's, jumped to 109 cases in 1977, and fell somewhat to 79 cases opened in 1980. Presumably the fluctuations reflect general unrest and the likelihood that trouble spots around the world generate activity in the U.S. that is in violation of the neutrality acts. (u)

All 59 Field Offices report opening a total of 5541 cases. New York has the greatest number (783) followed by Washington (427) and Los Angeles (362). It appears that destruction in the field has been substantial. One-half of New York's cases, one-third of Washington's and well over one-half of Los Angeles' files in this classification have been destroyed. (u)

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With the exception of New York, the Field Office files rated consistently lower than those of Headquarters. The ratings are as follows:

Of 47 cases read in the Field, there was 1 high, 4 mediums, 7 lows, and 36 nones (25% with some research value). The high was a multi-section file on Angolan mercenaries that contained information of Daniel Gearhart. The mediums were 49, 43 and 79 serials. Only the 79 serial case is multi-section. Lows included a multi-section survey of anti-Castro terrorist activities in 1976-77, information on anti-Samoza activity in the 1940's and '50's, and planning a mission to the UN to rescue POWs (in Iran??) in 1981 (this case is 3 serials). (u)

Recommendations:

Although the subject matter covered in this classification is clearly of importance, there is a general lack of substantive data and frequency of unsubstantiated allegations in the case files. The only factor that appears at all valid for determining value is size of file. Multi-sections do seem to have comparatively more value, but one of the two mediums in Headquarters and 2 of the 3 in the field were single section. If a cut-off of 40 serials is used, all but 1 medium is included. (u)

The recommendation, therefore, is to retain the OO file, all exceptional and multi-section cases, and a statistical sample of the cases at Headquarters. In the field all cases exceeding 40 serials should be preserved. Consistency would dictate the retention of Headquarters correlates to the Field Office files and vice versa. (u)

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Foreign Miscellaneous

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Historical Synopsis

This classification pre-dates the 1921 changes in records system and was used as a miscellaneous serials classification for police and foreign intelligence information from foreign countries. The early case files are country files, and the classification was called "Latin American Matters" until 1944. (u)

Volume

There are almost 50,000 case files in Headquarters (700 cubic feet). None of the files have been microfilmed. There are 691 multi-section files in Headquarters averaging 6 sections. (u)

The Field Offices have opened 12,000 cases, and though there has been destruction of the Field Office files, it does not seem to be as great as in criminal classifications. (u)

The number of cases opened in this classification dropped dramatically in 1961, and very few cases are now being opened. Other classifications are being used, and the Bureau identifies classification 64 as a "control file." (u)

Profile

NARS reviewed 35 case files in Headquarters. They were rated as 4 medium, 14 low, and 16 none. The mediums were usually country files and files on the Communist Party in certain countries. Files included cases on police cooperation with other countries. The later files were routine security clearances from foreign governments. (u)

The ratings in the Los Angeles and Washington Field Offices were all none for historical value. Most of the cases were opened in the 1960's and were security checks referred from Headquarters. The Auxiliary Office--Office of Origin breakdown in the Washington Field Office was 15 auxiliary and 4 office of origin files. (u)

The New York Field Office ratings included 1 high, 1 medium, 3 lows, and 27 nones. Again the files rated none were routine security investigations and usually Auxiliary Office files. The more highly rated files were country files or files on foreign communists. (u)

Two multi-section files were examined in the Headquarters multi-section survey; both were rated as medium in historical value. (u)

Recommendations

The FBI had special investigation responsibilities for Latin America before and during World War II and its Special Intelligence Service (SIS) program is documented in this classification. As the one overseas FBI program of major significance, it is important that the records of SIS be preserved. (u)

[Redacted] Most were routine security checks and requests for information. In Headquarters all case files opened through 1950, the 00

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file, all exceptional and all multi-section cases should be retained. A statistical sample of all remaining case files also should be retained. All other files should be destroyed. In the field all exceptional and multi-section cases should be retained. In the Legats all case files opened through 1961 should be retained. (4) (8) (41)

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Laboratory Research Matters

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Historical Synopsis:

This classification was established to accommodate files relating to the Technical Laboratory founded by the Bureau in 1932. Unlike Classification 95, this Classification is not used to document individual laboratory analyses. Rather, its contents can be grouped into the following three categories: (1) files relating to various public relations activities, (2) files relating to forensic techniques of interest to the Bureau, and (3) files relating to the administration of the Bureau Lab. The presence of the first category of material reflects the fact that between 1946 and 1955, this classification was entitled "Public Relations Matters." (u)

In January 1946 FBI Field Offices were instructed to establish an 80 classification for various types of speech material." Examination of files in this classification in Chicago, New York and Los Angeles identified a variety of content. Recognizable categories of material include (1) reports of interesting cases, (2) files documenting contacts with local police departments, (3) files documenting contacts with local newspapers and broadcasting stations, (4) files documenting contacts with District and State's Attorneys as well as the Attorney General of the U.S., (5) files documenting contacts with hotels, banks and other local business establishments and (6) files documenting contacts with individuals (i.e., civic leaders). (u)

Volume:

There are 879 case files in this classification in Headquarters. They occupy 174 cubic feet and are preceded by a one-section 00 file. There is no 0 file. The total number of multi-sections is 193, averaging 8 sections. The annual rate of file openings is small, averaging 3 per year. A list of extant cases along with their captions is available. Destruction of obsolete material has been authorized. Fifty-eight Field Offices report having open files in this classification. The largest number of files has been opened by Buffalo with 2209, Alexandria reports opening less than 100 cases. Destruction of obsolete material has taken place. (u)

Recommendations:

Headquarters:

Because of the heterogeneous character of this classification, both in Headquarters and the field, the sampling technique applied to homogeneous classifications was not used. Instead virtually all Headquarters files and all types of field office files were reviewed. (u)

With a few exceptions, most of the case files numbered 1 to 92 in Headquarters concern public relations activities either at Headquarters or in various Field Offices. File number 1 covers general matters and clippings (dating from 1932 to 1967). The file was weeded in 1965, and it now consists almost exclusively of substantive documents. It warrants permanent retention. Files 80-20 through 80-40 in Headquarters cover public relations in the various Field

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Offices operating at the time class 80 was established. Headquarters files 2 through 19 and 41 through 100 relate to public relations activity involving Headquarters. Some relate to book manuscripts some to radio, television or movie scripts. Authorization should be withheld until the value of materials in all these files can be considered in the context of material filed in classification 94. As part of its public relations program, the Bureau encouraged members of the laboratory staff to prepare essays describing "interesting identifications." Copies of 400 such essays, written between 1934 and 1940, are filed in cases 80-101 through 80-500 in Headquarters. Since they provide some insight into the early work of the laboratory, they should be retained. (u)

Understandably, most of the files in classification 80 in Headquarters relate to the development or implementation of forensic techniques. A substantial subset of these files document the establishment of standard or reference collections of items useful in the solution of crimes (type faces, fibers, handwriting specimens, firearms, etc.). Because of the importance of these collections to the law enforcement community, the "control" files relating to them are worthy of preservation. See attachment A. (u)

It is more difficult to judge the value of the files in Headquarters on individual forensic techniques. All files relating to "extraordinary investigative techniques," (i.e., telephone and microphone surveillance, radio monitoring, sound recording, motion activated surveillance, etc.) should be retained. This recommendation does not extend to the retention of radio monitoring logs filed in classification 80. The files give parameters of radio monitoring sessions at various locations. Other forensic technique files worthy of retention include files relating to cryptography, to fingerprint analysis, to handwriting analysis and to document examination. With the exception of file 80-807 (research and development), other files relating to forensic techniques appear to be disposable. (u)

Headquarters files relating to administrative matters are listed in attachment B. The most important of these is 80-11 (now occupying 7 file drawers) which includes the monthly reports of the laboratory. It is worthy of permanent retention. File number 80-98 ("outside experts") includes one sub-file for each outside expert contacted by the Bureau. The subs are set up in chronological order at the time of contact. They currently number in the thousands and until a satisfactory sampling technique is devised disposal is not authorized. Case number 80-606 ("crime laboratories in the U.S.") should be retained for the information it contains about the Bureau's reluctance to recognize local expertise. (u)

The copies of interesting cases filed in classification 80 in the field duplicate material already designated permanent at Headquarters. Thus, Field Office files of this type may be destroyed. (u)

Field:

Field files documenting contacts with state and local law enforcement agencies maintained in this classification contain a mixture of trivial and substantive information. While it is true that files of this type also exist in the Central Records System at Headquarters, the extent of duplicate material is not easily established. All should be retained permanently. (u)

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Field files documenting contacts with the media appear to consist of documents and information regularly forwarded to Headquarters (newsclippings, correspondence, and press releases). Since one copy of each serial relating to contact with the press in a specific case is filed in the relevant investigative case file, this category of material in classification 80 in the field may be destroyed when no longer needed. (u)

Field files documenting contacts with District and States Attorneys and with the U.S. Attorney General, contain material of local interest not forwarded to Headquarters. They should be retained permanently. (u)

Files in this classification in at least one Field Office indicate that an effort was made to cultivate contacts in local businesses (hotels, banks, etc.) who could be counted on to provide useful information. Since utilization of such contacts would be documented in retained Field Office investigative files, this category of liaison material in classification 80 in the field may be destroyed. (u)

The classification appears to be at least one possible location for field files documenting "SAC contacts" with local civic leaders. The potential variety of contacts and the possibility that some of these contacts might be of historical interest justifies the permanent retention of the files SAC contract files in the field. (u)

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Foreign Agents Registration Act

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Historical Synopsis:

The Bureau opened this classification in 1939 to document violations of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938. The Act requires "foreign propagandists" or "agents of a foreign principal" engaged in distributing propaganda to register with the State Department. In 1950, the Bureau investigated persons who failed to register under Section 20 of the Internal Security Act requiring registration of persons having knowledge of espionage, counter-espionage, or sabotage service or tactics of the government of a foreign country. (u)



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This classification according to the 00 file, should contain only individuals. Organizations are covered under the Voorhis Act, Classification 102. However, organizations have been listed since very early in the history of the classification. (u)

Volume:

There are 5,750 cases in this classification at Headquarters comprising approximately 204 cubic feet. All are paper, including 329 multi-section files, 5.7% of cases, averaging 4 sections each. (u)

Fifty-seven Field Offices opened cases with New York (2,814) and Washington (2,248) having almost three times as many files as the next highest office (San Juan). Twenty-eight offices opened 100 or more case files. Washington and Los Angeles show destruction of earlier case files while New York apparently destroyed very little. (u)

Profile:

NARS examined 34 files in the Headquarters sample, and 3 multi-section files. Files in Los Angeles and Washington relating to Headquarters files were also reviewed. (u)

The Headquarters-Washington comparison rated medium in both Headquarters and the Field but appeared to have unique documents in the Field such as information from the subject and special agent to special agent in charge memos. Another comparison of 19 serials in the Field and 8 in Headquarters rated low in Los Angeles and medium in Headquarters. The Field file included affidavits, reports from Auxillary Offices, notes of interviews, and SA-SAC

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memoranda none of which went to Headquarters. While the highs ranged from 40 to over 1,100 serials, mediums included case files of 1, 2, and 8 serials. An even greater range in serials occurred among the lows and nones. These contained as many as 48 serials and three were over 1/4 inch thick. Classifications 105, [] 65, and 109 were all associated with one or more high and medium files, but a none also had foreign counter-intelligence associations. (u)

All highs, 7 of 10 sample files rated medium, and all three multi-section files contained informant information. Since half the lows and two mediums did not have easily identifiable informant information, however, this seems to be as risky as a serial count to determine those items with research potential. Few if any of the cases, regardless of rating, resulted in prosecution. (u)

The 37 section 0 file contain many serials of more than routine interest and should be retained. (u)

NARS examined 86 files in New York, Los Angeles, and Washington. This included the 3 comparisons discussed above and 6 extras. Besides the characteristics that appeared significant in the Headquarters files, Field files were checked for biographical data and electronic surveillance. No correlations appeared between research interest and these characteristics. (u)

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Of the Field Office files, 17.4 % of the total rated high or medium; 50% had research potential. Comments on some Auxiliary Office low cases indicated that Headquarters or Office of Origin files would have rated higher. (u)

The cases reviewed in Washington contained information that Headquarters would receive. New York and Los Angeles, however, contained files with material that would not be sent to Headquarters. (u)

Recommendations:

This classification contains many files with research potential. Twenty-three per cent are high and medium and no correlations exist making it possible to identify cases with research potential. Nevertheless, some ways to divide the files were established. Those files concerning organizations should all be retained. This would capture some routine as well as exceptional cases. With individuals, however, the work of the FBI frequently comes to an end when the subject either leaves the country or registers. Many of the files have serials cross-filed under classifications 65, 105, [] or 100. Exceptional cases, multi-section cases at Headquarters and the Field, and case files retained in other classifications will capture virtually all the unique data from this classification. Headquarters correlates to Office of Origin multi-section cases also should be retained. A statistical sample will bring in routine as well as valuable cases and have evidential value for the breadth of the classification. (u)

Foreign Counterintelligence - Russia
(formerly Internal Security) (Nationalistic Tendency -
Foreign Intelligence)(Individuals and Organizations - by country)

Historical Synopsis

The FBI established this classification in 1944 for investigations to protect the national security of the United States. Until July, 1944, classification 100 was used for all internal security matters, but with the establishment of classification 105, classification 100 was limited to security matters concerning Russian and Communist matters while 105 concerned all other countries and nationalist groups (particularly, during the rest of World War II, German, Italian and Japanese groups). In September 1945, instructions from Headquarters sharply cut activity in classification 105 by ordering Field Offices to stop investigations in all nationalistic categories except those concerning Communists, Russians, Marxist groups, and the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico - most of which came under 100. (u)

In October 1948 classification 100 became Security Matters-C (communist) and Internal Security-C (communist), to focus on the Communist Party USA and related domestic organizations. Classification 105 became Internal Security - Nationalistic Tendency, to focus on Soviet and other nationalistic individuals and groups for foreign counterintelligence activities. (u)

In the mid 1950's 105 was used not only to investigate aliens, especially from Russia and Eastern Europe, but also to investigate the Klan, anti-Semitic and other hate groups. In 1959 these investigations were transferred to classification 157. In the late 1950s and early 1960's investigations focused increasingly on Puerto Rican groups and especially on pro-Castro and anti-Castro Cuban groups. In the 1960s classification 105 was also used to investigate Chinese communist activities. (u)

In 1971 the classification was renamed Internal Security-Nationalistic Tendency (Foreign Intelligence), but investigations went beyond the activities of foreign intelligence services to include groups working for foreign political movements, such as IRA supporters, Arab terrorists, the Jewish Defense League, Yugoslav emigre groups, and Cuban groups. (u)

In September 1977, classification 105 was limited to foreign counterintelligence investigations directed only at Russia, as other new classifications were established for other operations that previously had been included. The new classifications are:

Volume

At Headquarters there are 334,910 cases totalling 5,565 cubic feet. These include 5,325 multi-section cases with an average of 4 sections. The 0 file of 695 sections begins with records dated 1937. (u)

In the field 59 offices have opened 936,285 cases. While some files have been

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destroyed a very large volume remains extant. For example, New York reports having 5,857 feet from its 169,707 cases; Washington has 3,061 feet from its 148,813 cases; Los Angeles has 613 feet from its 48,374 cases; and Newark has 308 feet from its 38,855 cases. At less active offices Atlanta still has 129 feet from its 7,046 cases, Dallas has 70.5 feet from its 6,706 cases, and Miami has 3.6 feet from its 24,402 cases. Chicago, Los Angeles, Miami and Atlanta all reported destroying many of their classification 105 case files. (u)

Profile

At Headquarters, NARS reviewed 165 cases dated 1944-81 in the sample. They were rated as 1 high, 7 medium, 36 low, and 121 none. (u)

At all 7 Field Offices visited by NARS, cases dated 1944-80 were rated as 8 high, 28 medium, 164 low, and 577 none. (u)

Cases of the Hong Kong Legat, dated 1966-76, were rated as 1 medium, 4 low, and 28 none. The 69 cases from the Mexico City Legat were rated 1 medium, 21 low, and 47 none. (u)

The combined ratings of all reviewed cases from Headquarters, 7 Field Offices, and the Mexico City Hong Kong Legats are 9 high, 37 medium, 225 low, and 774 none. (u)

Efforts to correlate the ratings with such factors as results of case and amount of biographical detail, yielded no conclusions. No clear correlation with the presence or absence of electronic surveillance, informant information, or security classified information and the various ratings was noted. (u)

There is some correlation between the ratings and the size of the case file. The apparent tendency is for research potential to increase with the size of the file. All the high cases, for instance, are multi-section. Well over $\frac{1}{2}$ of the medium cases, however, are a single volume and many of them are less than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch in size. The none cases were virtually all small, 90-95% were under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch and none exceeded one section. (u)

A wide variety of matters not confined strictly to Soviet foreign counterintelligence was investigated under classification 105. At Atlanta there were cases involving the Nation of Islam, Dominican revolutionaries, and Cubans; at Miami cases concerned the Nation of Islam, Dominican Republic intelligence operations in the United States, and many Cuban groups; at Dallas there were several cases concerning suspected Arab terrorists; at Los Angeles cases included Poles, Mexicans, Black Muslims, and a large file on CORE with informant reports and phone taps; at Chicago cases dealt with Poles, other Eastern Europeans and an Israeli; at New York cases involved Cubans, Yugoslavs, an Eritrean liberation group, and a Raoul Wallenberg Committee; at Washington and at Headquarters there were a variety of East Europeans. All these subjects were in addition to the many cases focusing directly on Soviet activities. (u)

The cases with no research potential typically were ones with disproven charges, negative results, or definite findings of no subversive activity or intelligence significance. These cases often involved FBI monitoring of Eastern bloc officials visiting the United States, checks on Americans

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traveling to Russia and other Iron Curtain countries, or writing, phoning or visiting Iron Curtain embassies and consulates. In these cases FBI investigations normally found no indication of espionage or definitely established innocent reasons for the subjects' actions. Thus Soviet visitors often stuck to the stated purposes for their visits without any efforts at intelligence gathering, Americans traveled to Russia and other Eastern Bloc nations to visit relatives or just for vacations, and American high school and grade school students contacted Communist embassies to get information for homework assignments. (u)

Recommendations

At Headquarters the 00 file merits permanent retention to document policies and procedures. While most of the 0 file consists of disposable miscellaneous correspondence and crank mail and should be destroyed, those portions from 1937 through 1944 when the classification was established, should be retained. (u)

The evidence indicates that multi-section case files are likely to have research value. Therefore all multi-section cases at Headquarters and at Offices of Origin in the field should be permanent. (u)

Of the 968 cases reviewed there were 230 single section cases with research potential (28 medium, 202 low). Of course, there were also 721 single section cases with no research potential, of which 90-95% were under 1/4 inch. (u)

The ratings do not reveal any vast difference in the research potential of cases at Headquarters and in the field. Moreover, the date span of the cases are exactly the same at Headquarters and in the 7 Field Offices. In addition, some field files contained more complete and historically useful information than Headquarters files. Consequently, the disposition for single section cases should retain the same level of historical information at Offices of Origin in the field as at Headquarters. (u)

There appear to be three choices: saving all, sampling, or selecting by size. Keeping all the files is undesirable because it commits the Archives to a very large series (and one still growing - e.g. 14,304 cases opened in 1976, 10,071 in 1977, 5,635 in 1978, 5,974 in 1979 and 4,713 in 1980 at Headquarters alone) in which over half the cases have no research value. Statistical sampling, while reducing the volume, still retains a series with more than half the cases lacking research potential. Selection of case files by size also reduces the volume, screens out most of the valueless cases, and loses few historically useful cases. The resultant series would be historically richer in relation to total volume than in either of the other alternatives. (u)

NARS found many lows and virtually all ones are under 1/4 inch. This size case file usually contains 5 to 15 serials in Headquarters files. Consequently, for Headquarters, all cases with 10 or more serials should be retained. Since Field Office cases include typically a number of routine administrative documents of no historical value, the serial cut-off should be higher. All Field Office of Origin case files with 15 or more serials should be retained. This will capture the worthwhile cases in the field. (u)

In addition, a systematic sample for evidential purposes should be retained at Headquarters to document the way in which the Bureau typically handled routine cases.

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Also, for basic documentation all informant cases are permanent at Headquarters as are their correlate case files at Offices of Origin in the field. (u)

The same disposition instructions for Offices of Origin in the field apply to the legat records in this classification. (u)

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Foreign Political Matters

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Historical Synopsis:

This classification was established in 1944 to keep better administrative control of political matters pertaining to foreign countries. Before 1944 such particular subject matter was placed in classification 64, "Foreign Miscellaneous." Investigations relate to general political matters in other countries and groups or individuals planning military or political action against incumbent foreign governments provided these groups violated no U.S. laws while they operated in the United States. The Bureau traditionally monitored persons and groups engaged in organizing revolutionary activities against foreign governments. (u)

To improve this political intelligence reporting, the Bureau in 1959 requested all Field Offices to maintain close contact with the Immigration and Naturalization Service concerning aliens in the United States. The Passport Office of the State Department is contacted concerning visa matters. The Bureau also obtains information on a continuing basis from intelligence and military agencies, and foreign governments. (u)

Volume:

All 708 cases opened in Headquarters are extant and total 260 cubic feet. There are 223 multi-section cases which average 12 sections. It appears that this classification has the highest ratio of multi-section cases to total cases within the Central Filing System. At least three-fourths of the volume in this classification is from case 109-12, subcases 201-403, which is a large (2244 sections) country control file. Cuba is designated 109-12-210, France is 109-12-225, and Israel is 109-12-345. Many of the country files (subcases) were opened in 1944-45 and are still very active, multi-section files. (u)

About 2903 cases were opened in 55 Field Offices. Destruction has been substantial but certain Field Offices still maintain major holdings including large country control files which were opened in the 1940s and 1950s. (u)

Profile:

NARS reviewed 20 cases in Headquarters. In this sample 1 case was rated as having high research potential, 11 medium, 5 low, and 3 none. The sample indicates that 17 out of 20 cases had research value. Of the 12 cases rated medium or high in research value, 11 are single section cases. These cases, opened between 1944 and 1965 relate to individuals who are potential political leaders of foreign governments, leaders of foreign revolutionary organizations operating in the United States and abroad, and domestic or foreign events or activities bearing on Bureau program responsibilities. In those cases pertaining to individuals, substantial biographical data is provided. (u)

NARS also examined 49 cases in Washington Field Office, New York, Los Angeles, Mexico City, and Hong Kong. In these samples 2 cases were rated high, 17 medium, 13 low, and 17 none in terms of research value. The same types of information identified in Headquarters records can be found in Field Office records. Some of the country files in the Field, however, are multi-section and document activities over a 30-year span. Some of this information was not transmitted to Headquarters and constitutes valuable historical documentation. (u)

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Recommendations:

Because 85% of the cases examined at Headquarters have research potential, all cases in this classification are retained. These cases--in particular the country files--will be a major source of political and diplomatic research when made available. The OO file should be retained to document Bureau policy and procedures. The O file contains routine correspondence and should be destroyed. (u)

The field sample included both Office of Origin and Auxiliary Office records. About two-thirds of all cases examined in the field had research value, and because of unique information not sent to Headquarters, all Field Office records should be retained. (u)

Because of the nature of this classification, all legat case files also should be retained. (u)

Foreign Economic Matters

Historical Synopsis

This classification was established in 1943 for the purpose of collecting economic information concerning investigations outside the United States and for reports regarding foreign countries even though no investigation is conducted. The only change that occurred over time was the development of sub-categories by country. (u)

Volume

There are 172 case files at Headquarters totalling 21 cubic feet. The bulk of the records, however, are in case file 110-6, a control file with country subfiles. There are 19 multi-section cases with an average of 7 sections per file. No cases have been microfilmed. (u)

Forty-one Field Offices report opening 233 cases, New York City has the greatest number of cases (41). Most of the 41 offices have opened 5 or less cases in this classification. Some destruction has occurred in the field but most of the files opened in New York and Washington appear to be extant. (u)

Profile

NARS reviewed 10 cases, dating from 1944 to 1954, in the Headquarters statistical sample; 8 cases were rated as having no research potential and 2 were rated low. However, the sample failed to include case file 110-6 where the bulk of the records for this classification are located. Subject matter for the files reviewed included reports of anti-allied sentiment among foreign business interests, smuggling activities, and efforts by businesses to circumvent the Proclaimed List. The 2 lows dealt with the flight of German capital abroad and matters relating to the Proclaimed list. (u)

The profile for the field, however, differs sharply from that of Headquarters. NARS reviewed 7 cases in New York and 5 in Washington, D.C.; 6 of the 7 were rated low and 1 case, a multi-section control file on the embargo of goods from Cuba, was rated medium. Most cases contained informant information and provided details of economic activities in such countries as Brazil, Taiwan, the People's Republic of China, and Egypt, between 1960 and 1980. Of the 5 cases reviewed at Washington, 1 was rated none, 2 were low, and 2 were rated high. Again, informant sources and the use of electronic surveillance was evident from the files. In addition the files provided data on such topics as the activities of American business representatives in the People's Republic of China or the efforts of a Latin American country to circumvent the sugar quota. One of the 2 cases rated high was multi-section; the other was a single section. (u)

Recommendations

Given the failure at Headquarters to review the major case file series in this classification, the evidence for value must rest with the Field Office sample. Here, there are clear indications that this classification as a whole has significant research potential. Moreover, the use of informant sources and electronic surveillance indicate the presence of some information that may not be available elsewhere. Since this classification is not susceptible to sampling because of the internal file structure, and since slim files on an individual country may nonetheless be highly valuable, permanent retention of

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all Headquarters case files is recommended. (u)

The quality of Field Office files has been noted. In addition, 1 of the 2 cases rated high was not multi-section. On the basis of this evidence, and with the knowledge that Field Office files in this classification are few, the permanent retention of all Office of Origin case files is also recommended. (u)

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Foreign Funds

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Historical Synopsis

This classification is used as a control file for intelligence information of value on foreign funds. The classification began in 1944 and contains data on matters of interest to the Bureau even though no investigation is being conducted. The information is generally broken down by country. The FBI appears to work closely with the [redacted] in gathering information in this area. (u)

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Volume

A total of 6 cubic feet of records exist at Headquarters. While only 49 cases have been opened, this number does not reflect the existence of large country sub-files within case 112-8. No files have been microfilmed. 11 cases have multi-sections with an average of 5 sections per case (although these are most likely within 112-8). The 0 file has been checked out since 1979. (u)

Eighteen Field Offices report opening a total of 37 cases in this classification. New York, with 11 cases, opened the greatest number. Most offices have opened only 1 case. There is evidence of destruction in this classification, for only 2 of New York's 11 cases are extant. No information is available on the number of legats that opened cases in this classification. (u)

Profile

NARS reviewed 10 cases, opened between 1944 and 1953, at Headquarters. Six cases were rated none, two were deemed to have low research potential, and three received a medium rating. However, one case marked medium was 112-8 which is over 330 sections and represents the bulk of the material in this classification. Typical subjects include the tracing of German funds to Latin American countries after World War II, unusual transfers of funds from U.S. banks to other countries, and the sale of U.S. dollars on the black market. Evidence of mail intercepts, use of informants, and other sensitive information was noted. (u)

Of 4 cases read in the field (2 in New York and 2 at Washington Field Office), none were deemed to have research potential. The largest file was 4 serials, and most recent date for the opening of a case was 1971. It should be noted that in 3 of the 11 Headquarters cases, the Office of Origin was a legat (Rio de Janeiro, Bogota, and Buenos Aires). Unfortunately, neither Mexico City nor Hong Kong, the legats whose records were sampled by the Task Force, contain files in this classification. (u)

Recommendations

The Bureau's sources for information relating to financial transactions in foreign countries clearly includes a variety of non-public, sometime unique conduits. It is highly likely that although some portions of these files are routine or of minimal research interest, other materials have significant research potential and the information cannot be obtained elsewhere. Moreover, the relative paucity of multi-section files and the use of country subfiles makes it impossible to apply either the multi-section file theory or a sampling approach. Therefore, all Headquarters case files and the 00 file should be retained permanently. The evidence suggests that no Field Office files need be retained; there is insufficient evidence to determine the value of legat files. (u)

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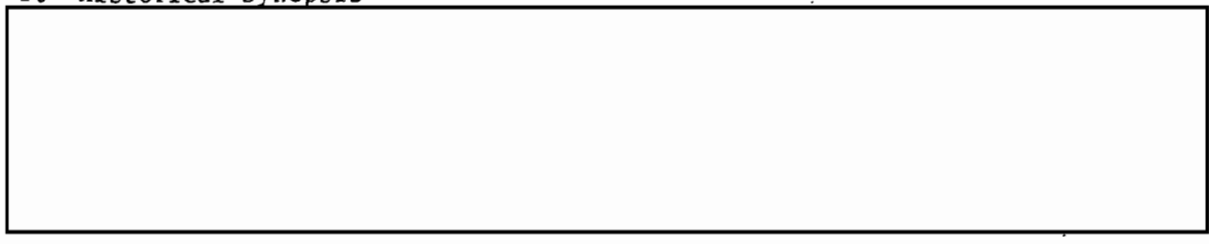
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Foreign Military and Naval Affairs

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1. Historical Synopsis



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2. Volume

Headquarters has opened 54 cases which total 13 cubic feet. No files have been microfilmed. There are 19 multi-section cases which average 5 volumes. These figures are misleading because case file 113-7 is a multi-section control file and accounts for the greater part of the volume in Headquarters. Thirty Field Offices reported opening a total of 102 cases. New York with 25 and Washington with 14 have the largest holdings. There are no figures to measure the extent of case files created by the Legal Attaches. (u)

NARS reviewed 11 cases in Headquarters consisting of the regular sample of 10 and a second sub-file from 113-7. The files were rated as 2 lows and 9 nones. The lows, both in 113-7, contained biographical indicators and letterhead memoranda. Headquarters files contained copies rather than original documents. Materials came from "other Government agencies" to Headquarters, and to the field from Headquarters. (u)

NARS also examined 10 cases in New York and Washington. They were rated as 1 medium, 8 lows, and 1 none. The medium on Cuban missiles was an Auxiliary Office case open for 10 years. Field Office files tended to be larger and to be opened for long periods of time. Most of the lows, for example, had over 100 serials each. By physical size the field files were not exceptionally thick - only one had over 1 section. The primary research interests included military affairs and international relations. (u)

4. Recommendations

Case file 113-7, the control file, contains sub-files confined to specific countries which are open for long periods of time, have a large number of serials, and would collectively support research in this area.

Although the files contain little original material, either in Headquarters or in the field, it is a bread-and-butter information source on foreign military and naval affairs and on the interrelationship and cooperation between intelligence agencies. (u)

All Headquarters, Office of Origin, and Legat case files should be retained. (u)

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Historical Synopsis

The FBI established this classification April 3, 1961, to document its role in handling requests from foreign police for information or investigative assistance. In general, the FBI complies with such requests unless it believes it inadvisable to do so. However, in domestic security matters the FBI provides only information and does not furnish investigative assistance unless the individual or group meets the criteria established by the Attorney General for initiating domestic security investigations. This classification covers such matters as: requests for information on foreign nationals who have previously resided in the U.S. and whose backgrounds are being checked for security clearance purposes; requests for information on U.S. citizens who are suspected of or charged with criminal violations in foreign countries; requests for information regarding American contacts of foreign radicals. In addition, this classification covers cases in which other Federal agencies request information from foreign governments on U.S. citizens who have lived abroad. Most of these requests come from military agencies conducting personnel security checks. FBI Headquarters is Office of Origin for these cases. ~~(u)~~

Volume

Headquarters has opened 49,184 cases comprising 450 cubic feet of textual records. There are 41 multi-section files. (u)

In the field the FBI has opened 46,678 Auxiliary Office files in this classification at its domestic Field Offices. A substantial additional number of Auxiliary Office files have been opened at its foreign legal attache offices (Legats). Most Field Offices and legats have disposed of a major portion of their holdings under FBI procedures for destroying Auxiliary Office files in which Headquarters is Office of Origin 10 years after close of case. Chicago and Los Angeles, however, were among a minority of Field Offices in which no disposal of files under this classification had occurred. (u)

Profile

At Headquarters NARS reviewed a sample of 35 files; 34 of 35 cases had no research value, and the remaining case was rated low. Twenty of 35 files had two or fewer serials, and 33 of 35 had five or less. These files contain only a limited amount of documentation, and full biographical details were available in only a minority of cases for the subjects of the files. Eighteen cases originated with requests from foreign governments, while 15 originated with other Federal agencies, chiefly the military. One file documented the use of a special investigative technique. ~~(u)~~

In the Field Offices NARS evaluated 138 files at Los Angeles (33 cases), New York (35 cases), Chicago (34 cases), and Washington (36 cases). In addition, four extra files were evaluated at the Washington and New York Field Offices. All but 11 of 138 files in the basic sample, and all four "extras," had no research value. None of the remaining files had more than low research value. In the New York sample, 15 cases involved American citizens as their subjects, while 14 involved foreign nationals. ~~(u)~~

The sample reviewed for the Legal Attaches in Mexico City (30 cases) and Hong Kong (10 cases) showed 38 of 40 cases had no research value. One case was rated low and the other medium. (u)

Recommendations

These cases involve facilitative matters in which the FBI provides information to foreign

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governments or obtains information from foreign governments for other Federal agencies. In a great majority of cases the FBI provides such information on the basis of records checks without conducting any additional investigation. The foreign government or other Federal agency retains investigative responsibility over these matters. Given the limited role of the FBI in these cases, it is not surprising that almost all files in this classification, with their limited content, fail to document the outcome of the investigation. Ninety-three percent of the files (199 of 213) evaluated in the classification had no research value. As the files lack substantive research value, only an evidential sample of the records need be preserved to document the FBI's conduct of investigations in this area. The remainder of the Headquarters case files (exclusive of the 00 file, multi-section files, and any exceptional cases that may appear) and field records do not merit permanent retention. It should be noted that NARS previously has examined, appraised, and approved disposal of similar case files of the Department of Justice's Interpol office, which handles foreign police requests for information from other law enforcement agencies in the United States. R(u)

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Foreign Counterintelligence - Terrorism (S)u

Historical Synopsis

This classification was established by Bureau directive of September 8, 1977, to provide better administrative control of investigations of foreign terrorist activities in the United States. The FBI defines terrorism as violent criminal activities conducted within the United States by various foreign organizations. Among the larger groups investigated are the Irish Republican Army (IRA). [redacted]

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Volume

Between 1977 and 1981, 3,618 cases were opened and amount to 40.5 cubic feet of records. There are 27 multi-sections averaging 6 sections. This multi-section number, however, does not account for the number of sections within 199-1-subcases 201-437 (foreign countries). In the Field 13,572 cases were opened by 59 Field Offices. All the Field Office cases are extant except those Auxiliary Office cases which were destroyed. (u)

Profile

Of the 34 cases reviewed in Headquarters, 2 were rated as having medium research value, 25 had low research value, and 7 had no research value. No multi-section cases were examined. Cases having serial counts above 20, usually had more research value. This correlation also was true for Field Office records. Many of the cases included information given by Bureau informants. (u)

In the Field 90 cases were examined in New York, Los Angeles, Miami, and Washington Field Offices. Of these cases, 3 had high research value, 4 had medium research value, 14 had low research value, and 69 had no research value. The three high cases had serial sizes of 105, 266, and 494 and all were multi-section. The 4 medium value cases had serial sizes of 12, 4, 58, and 78. Most of the cases examined had foreign nationals as the subjects of cases and considerable biographical data is present. (u)

Recommendations

The 00 file documents how Foreign Counterintelligence - Terrorism investigations are conducted and should be retained. The 0 file should be destroyed. All exceptional cases and all cases files with 20 or more serials should be retained. Control file 199-1-201-437 is permanent. All other case files can be destroyed. (u)

Outside Headquarters, all exceptional cases and all case files with 20 or more serials are to be retained. All other case files can be destroyed. (u)

Headquarters has opened 11,749 cases which comprise 108 cubic feet. Over 9,500 cases were opened during 1979 and 1980. There are 13 multi-section cases averaging 7 sections. There is a 61 section 0 file, with 12 sections being created between April and August 1981. (u)

All 59 Field Offices report opening over 27,000 cases. Over half of these cases have been opened in Washington, New York, San Francisco, Los Angeles, and Chicago. (u)

3. Profile

NARS reviewed 35 cases in the Headquarters sample; 1 was rated medium, 22 low, and 11 none. Twelve of the cases had an American citizen as the subject. There was almost no correlation between research potential and whether informant information and electronic surveillance was identified. Only 3 of the 35 cases had more than 8 serials. The medium rated case had 20 serials. No multi-section cases were reviewed. (u)

In the field NARS reviewed 106 cases in Los Angeles, New York, and Washington. Two comparison cases were reviewed in Los Angeles, with respect to research potential, of the 106 cases reviewed 5 were rated medium, 36 low (including the 2 specials), and 65 none. Sixteen cases had Americans as the main subject. There was no correlation between research potential and whether informant information and electronic surveillance was identified. Three multi-section cases were reviewed as part of the sample. All were rated as having medium research potential. (u)

4. Recommendation

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Volume

Headquarters opened 717 cases in 1977. By the end of 1980 Headquarters had opened 10,866 case files (99 cubic feet). This includes 9 multi-section cases having an average of 6 sections. All Field Offices have opened cases in this classification with a total of 37,370 cases opened through 1980. There has been little, if any, destruction in this classification. The Field Offices opening the largest number of cases are New York, Washington, Chicago, Los Angeles, Detroit, and Newark. The 1978 changes in reporting procedures do not appear to have affected the number of cases opened in Headquarters on an annual basis. (u)

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The profile above, for case files in the regular samples, supports the retention of multi-section case files. The number of serials in the case files reviewed ranged from 2 to 517. The high had 79 serials; the mediums 4 to 517 serials. (u)

Recommendations

Comments on the classification indicate retention for evidential reasons was more prevalent than retention for historical or informational value. The reviewer comments also stressed that the Field Office case files contained little information that would not be submitted to Headquarters. (u)

Because this classification will be subdivided in the near future and several countries removed into separate new classifications no evaluation or appraisal judgements should be made at this time. Therefore, disposal is not authorized for any Headquarters and Field Office of Origin records. Auxiliary Offices should be permitted to destroy their records in accordance with established time frames for security records. (u)

Headquarters has opened 3046 cases which total 36 cubic feet. These include 8 multi-section cases averaging 15 sections. (u)

b1 In the field 58 offices reported opening 9,193 cases. Nearly all the cases remain extant at the offices opening the most cases: Miami with 4,082 cases totaling 62.8 feet, New York with 1,217 cases totaling 128 feet, Washington with 544 cases totaling 42 feet and Los Angeles with 416 cases totaling 17 feet. (u)

Profile:

At Headquarters NARS reviewed cases dated 1977-81. They were rated as 3 medium, 18 low and 8 none. NARS examined 81 cases in Los Angeles, Miami, New York and Washington Field Offices. These cases, dated 1977-81 were rated as 2 high, 3 medium, 22 low and 54 none. (u)

Recommendations:

At Headquarters the 00 file merits retention to document policies and procedures in this classification. The 0 file's disposition is "Disposal Not Authorized" because the file's unsettled character precludes an appraisal judgment at this time. The data on multi-section cases suggests all have research value. Consequently all multi-section cases are permanent at Headquarters and at Offices of Origin in the field. In addition, since multi-section cases are

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generally significant investigations, any Office of Origin case file in the field that is not itself a multi-section case but is the correlate to a retained Headquarters multi-section case also is permanent. (u)

Finally, this classification includes a mixture of historically valuable and worthless single section cases. Moreover, 74.8% of the Headquarters records have research potential while only 33% of the field records have research potential. A statistical sample, of Headquarters case files merits permanent retention. (u)

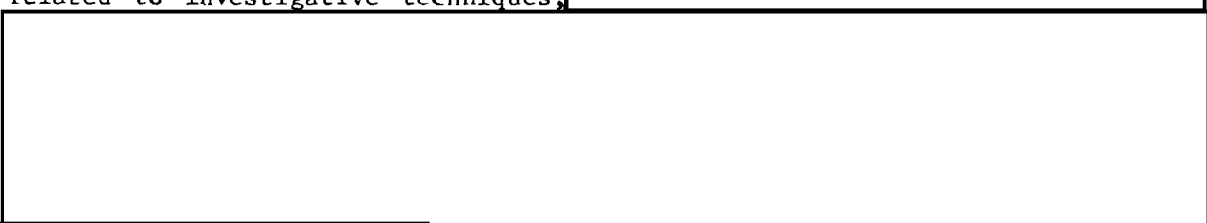

Foreign Counterintelligence - Intelligence Community Support

1. Historical Synopsis

This classification was established July 23, 1980, to maintain control over activities undertaken "to collect foreign intelligence or support foreign intelligence collection requirements of other agencies within the Intelligence Community" pursuant to Executive Order 12036 and National Security Council Directive NSC-35. Files were reclassified into this classification from classifications 80 and 105, and it is growing. (u)

2. Volume

More than 50 files exist in Headquarters and 5 field offices reported establishing 351 cases. By far the largest number of field cases is in New York. There are no multi-sectional cases in Headquarters, and the first ten case numbers are reserved. (u)

3. Profile

NARS reviewed 9 cases at Headquarters and 15 in New York. All but one of the Headquarters cases contained less than 20 serials, had security classified information, and were rated high, 6 low and 2 none. Some files contained only the serial establishing the class plus the name of the agency, organization, institution, or program that is the subject of the future file. In all cases, however, the fact of the existence of the file on the subject was of interest. (u)

In New York the 15 files were rated as 1 high, 5 medium, and 9 low. In most cases, the highest numbered serial was 1, because the files utilize a complex system of subfiles. One file, for example, had 17 subfiles, some of which were subfiles of subfiles. There is a standard pattern: subfile 1 is a copy of the court order, 2 is technical information, 3 is description of the subject or target, 4 is financial support for the program, 5 is miscellaneous, and numbers beyond 5 are subfiles for specific locations. The subfiles are often xeroxes, especially of the court orders, but there are also important unique items. In two files examined photographs and blueprints existed but were not in the file and were not listed as bulkies. The subfiles were not serialized. (u)

4. Recommendation

Although this is a new class, it is apparent that the case files document extremely important activities. The field reports to Headquarters do not appear to be files in 212 but perhaps either go directly to the agency on whose behalf the program was undertaken or to a topical case file in another classification. In any event, the most significant information is in the Field Offices. All case files in both Headquarters and Office of Origin should be retained. (u)

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Duplication, Headquarters and Field

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One of the key issues facing the FBI Appraisal Task Force was the character and extent of duplication between Headquarters and field case files. Two approaches were used to try to answer the question. First, during the examination of case files at Headquarters, the Office of Origin and its case file number were noted. A list of files reviewed at Headquarters that originated in the Washington, New York, Dallas, Chicago, Los Angeles, Miami, and Atlanta Field Offices was generated. In each Field Office, the task force attempted to locate the correlate case files. In the great majority of the cases, the Office of Origin file had been destroyed. Those that were extant were pulled and reviewed, and data collection sheets were completed.

Because this involved only a comparison of Headquarters files with Office of Origin files, this review was supplemented by a second study. In this study ten classifications were selected, covering security, criminal, applicant, and fraud violations. In each of these classifications, three Headquarters cases from the last third of the cases reviewed were selected. The last third was used because it represented the most recent cases and it was hoped that less destruction in the field would have taken place. FBI Headquarters then requested all Field Offices to send to Headquarters all files relating to these thirty cases (3 from each of the 10 classifications). When the files were received, team members took the Office of Origin file and listed the documents including serial number, correspondents, date, and information content. Then the Headquarters and Auxiliary Office files were checked against the list, again serial by serial, and differences noted. Finally, the reviewer wrote a summary of the differences and similarities among the files.

I. Headquarters - Office of Origin Comparison

One hundred sixty-five identical cases were reviewed in both Headquarters and the Office of Origin. The results in terms of research value are shown in the table below.

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II. Headquarters-Office of Origin-Auxiliary Office Comparison

Of the 30 cases selected in Headquarters by the team, 8 cases in 6 classifications were destroyed in the office of origin. Two of these cases had extant files in Auxiliary Offices; however, without Office of Origin files the comparison of Headquarters and Auxiliary Office records is meaningless. Seven offices were involved in the destruction, which included all 3 cases selected in classification 100. In addition, one file in which Headquarters was the Office of Origin had no remaining Auxiliary Office files. These nine cases were dropped from the comparison.

Four files in which Headquarters is the Office of Origin had extant records in Field Offices. Two of these were in classification 77, applicant, and one each in 2, neutrality, and 65, espionage. The first classification 77 file had 9 serials at Headquarters, 4 at New Haven, 2 in Cleveland, 5 in Albany, and 4 in Buffalo. The only two serials which were not duplicated in the Headquarters file were a serial in New Haven which imposed a reporting deadline and a serial in Albany which was a report from the agent to the Special Agent in Charge, the entire substance of which was included in a serial which appears in the Headquarters file. In this case all substantive information is in the Headquarters (i.e., the Office of Origin) file. The second 77 is different. Headquarters has only one serial, numbered 2. It merely asks the Washington Field Office where the investigative reporting on the case is. The Washington Field Office file, on the other hand, has 5 serials, not including the single document in Headquarters. These 5 serials contain the application, the report of the investigation, and some subsequent investigation. Obviously the substantive information is in the Auxiliary Office.

The case reviewed in classification 2 presents a third picture. In this case the action originates in the Legat in Panama (technically an Auxiliary Office, as Legats are never Offices of Origin), and the first serial in both the Legat and the Headquarters file is identical. However, the second serial in Panama indicates that since no further information has been received, the case is being closed administratively. That information is not present in the Headquarters file. The second serial in the Headquarters file shows that the information was sent to U.S. Customs, and this information does not appear in the Legat file. Here to get the whole picture both cases must be used. The classification 65 file has 13 numbered serials (two numbered 3), a "not recorded", and two enclosures in envelopes. The case involved three Field Offices--New York, Baltimore, and Washington Field--and all 3 Auxiliary Office cases survive. Each has one serial that is not in the Headquarters file: New York has a carbon copy of a request to the telephone company for a check on a telephone number; Baltimore has a memo from the person who did some investigation at Fort Detrick; Washington Field has an agent to SAC memo that reports receiving telephonically the information that Headquarters subsequently provided in serial 1. The Headquarters file includes the results of the telephone check and the Fort Detrick investigation, so the only information unique to the field files is the name of the person the Bureau contacted at the telephone company, the name of the person who performed the investigation at Fort Detrick, and the fact that Washington Field was called in advance of the memo from the Director starting the investigation. None of this seems substantive. The conclusion is that in 2 of these cases the Headquarters file is sufficient, in one case the field file is sufficient, and in one case both cases are required.

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The remaining 17 cases were evaluated as 9 completely duplicated in substance at Headquarters, 3 not duplicated in substance at Headquarters, and 5 with problems.

The 9 duplicated cases are in classifications 15, 91, 92 (3 cases), 164 (2), and 209 (2). Six had only the Office of Origin file extant in the field, 3 also had one Auxiliary Office. Two cases were opened in 1972, 1 each in 1973, 1974, 1976, 1977, and 1979, and 2 in 1980. Serials in the Office of Origin ranged from 9 to 76, Auxiliary Office serials ranged from 2 to 13, and Headquarter files ranged from 2 serials to 18. Of the 6 cases where only the Office of Origin file exists in the field, reviewers in each case indicated that particular elements of information are in the Office of Origin file that are not in Headquarters, but that these were not viewed as substantive either to the conduct of the investigation or to the evidence on the offense itself. In one case the Headquarters file contained information not in the files at the Office of Origin. In the 3 cases with one Auxiliary Office file extant the pattern held true: the Auxiliary Offices had serials that were not in either the Office of Origin or Headquarters, but again the reviewers commented that the important information was incorporated in investigative reports sent to both the Office of Origin and Headquarters.

Three cases were reviewed and found to have fuller information in the Field Office file than in the Headquarters file. One case was in classification 65 (dating from 1980), one was in 157 (1976), and one was in 209 (1978). In the 157 file, the reviewer commented that most of the information from the 17 serial Office of Origin file not in the 2 serial Headquarters file concerned the criminal activities and local police arrest records of the subject, his friends, and his relatives. It also had a small amount of information on some local disputes. However, the reviewer said, the basic information that nothing was found linking the subject to extremist activities was sent to Headquarters. In the 209 case, the reviewer found that most of the investigative information from the 27 serial Office of Origin file was included in the 6 serial Headquarters file. What was not included was a newspaper clipping and some information relating to conferences between an agent and the assistant U.S. Attorney concerning a determination to seek indictments. The 65 case has an Auxiliary Office and a Legat file. Although the Headquarters file has, according to the reviewer, all items of substance from the Office of Origin and the Field Office, [the Legat file has 2 documents related to liaison with a foreign government agency that are not recorded in either of the other files.] X(u)

The 5 files with problems remain. In the first, a file in classification 15, an 88 serial Office of Origin file was substantially duplicated in the Headquarters file through serial 77. The last serials in the Office of Origin file, however, provide information on legal proceedings in the case and are not in Headquarters. In addition, 2 statistics letters from the Office of Origin were not included in the Headquarters file; current practice at the time the case was active (1978-79) was not to serialize such items. One Auxiliary Office file also contained a statistics letter that was not included, although the basic documentation from that file--a telegram reporting the capture of the fugitive, an arrest report, and a report of the fugitive's appearance before the magistrate--are duplicated in both the Office of Origin and the Headquarters file. A second Field Office sent in a file

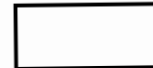

information about the person or entity shall be recorded with explanatory facts and circumstances in an investigative case file and shall be reviewed periodically by the SAC or designated field supervisor."

The retention schedules concerning destruction of informant files, which were submitted to the FBI by NARS on 9/28/81, provides no authorization for destruction called for by the Attorney General's Guidelines as enumerated above. Further, in discussions with NARS officials, they contend that the authority for the destruction of FBI records does not rest with the Attorney General, but with the Archivist of the United States.

The above issue will be covered in the informant sections of the FBI's disposition schedules, which are presently being revised and updated for submission to the Court on 11/9/81, in the civil matter "American Friends Service Committee, et al., v. William H. Webster, et al.," U.S. District Court, Washington, D. C., Civil Action Number 79-1655.

It is believed that some modifications to Part D(6) of the Attorney General's Guidelines will be necessary. We expect that the Court and the plaintiffs will take note of the conflict described above at evidentiary hearings in connection with the above-mentioned civil matter. Additional developments in this regard will be promptly reported.

I am writing to advise that the FBI Columbia Office is in possession of several documents, which were voluntarily furnished to the FBI by an official of the South Carolina State Employees Credit Union, Columbia, South Carolina, in connection with a bank larceny investigation. The subject of the FBI investigation plead guilty and was sentenced on September 21, 1981. The South Carolina State Employees Credit Union has requested that the documentary evidence furnished to the FBI be returned. The U.S. Attorneys Office in Columbia advised that the documentary evidence furnished to the FBI Columbia Office by the South Carolina State Employees Credit Union may be returned.

Normally, the FBI Columbia Office would duplicate the original of the documentary evidence in question and retain the copies in the FBI Columbia Office's case file pursuant to Judge Greene's July 28, 1981, Order in the civil matter "American Friends Service Committee et al., v. William H. Webster et al." However, such duplication may be prohibited by the Right to Financial Privacy Act (RFPA). The U.S. Department of Justice Civil Division has previously been requested to resolve this question with the Court; however, to date no resolution has been forthcoming.

The FBI Columbia Office has been instructed to forward the documentary evidence furnished by the South Carolina State Employees Credit Union to FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ) in order that it may be reviewed by an archivist of your agency to ascertain whether it has any historical

In the past, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has reviewed all Bureau information in documents held by the National Archives and Records Service (NARS). However, reviews of information created prior to 1946 indicate that only a few categories of documents contain classifiable information. With regard to documents created prior to 1946, only those that fall into one of the following categories need be referred to the FBI in the future:

1. "Intelligence information provided to the United States by any element of a foreign government, or international organization of governments, with the explicit or implicit understanding that the information is to be kept in confidence. This includes information revealing past, present, or proposed joint intelligence activities or facilities involving the United States in foreign countries. This category will be subject to another review at the end of a 10-year period.

2. "Intelligence information produced by the United States, whether unilaterally or jointly, with a foreign government or international organization of governments, pursuant to an arrangement with any elements of such government or organization evidenced by an exchange of letters, memorandum of understanding, or other written record and requiring that the information, the arrangement itself, or both be kept in confidence.

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NOTE: Statistical analysis of reviews of FBI information created prior to 1946, held at NARS and processed over the last nine months indicates that only one document in 1,000 is classified. The current backlog of documents is approximately 240,000 pages. At the current review rate, it will take 1,500 manhours to review those documents. An additional 280,000 pages have not been processed as yet by Archives personnel for referral to the FBI. This would take an additional 1,750 manhours to review. The limitation of information referred to the FBI will drastically reduce the backlog.

Due to the passage of time, the only sensitive information in need of classification is foreign government information, liaison with foreign intelligence agencies and CPUSA investigations. This matter has been coordinated with the Classification Training, Review and Clearances Unit, Document Classification and Review Section, Records Management Division, and with Mr. Edwin A. Thompson, NARS.

One of the key proposals in our proposed disposition schedules was that all FBI administrative and investigative files designated for permanent retention because of their historical or archival value be transferred to NARS after 50 years. The corresponding NARS proposed retention schedule for FBI records recommended that such files be transferred to NARS after 30 years, as provided in Title 44, U.S. Code, Section 2103. In discussions with NARS officials concerning this issue, it was resolved that the FBI might delay in transferring records that must be permanently retained to NARS for the use in the conduct of the regular current business of the FBI past the 30-year period recommended by NARS. It was further resolved that the FBI would document, on a classification-by-classification basis, that records to be permanently retained are being retained past the 30 year NARS recommended transfer date in order to assist in the conduct of the regular business of the FBI. NARS officials expressed the opinion that it would not be difficult to document extended retention past the 30-year transfer period recommended by NARS on this basis for certain classifications; however, NARS officials indicated that in other classifications, especially those classifications that are obsolete and those containing nonsensitive information, it would be most difficult to justify the extended retention of this material by the FBI.

In discussion with NARS officials, it was suggested that records designated for permanent retention in selected nonsensitive and obsolete classifications, identified in referenced memorandum, be transferred to NARS 30 years from the date of the last communication appearing in the file. In further discussions with NARS officials, the following additional nonsensitive classifications were identified for transfer to NARS after 30 years:

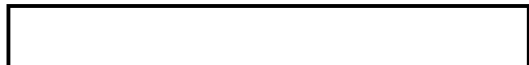

One of the key proposals in our proposed disposition schedules was that all FBI administrative and investigative files designated for permanent retention because of their historical or archival value be transferred to NARS after 50 years. The corresponding NARS proposed retention schedule for FBI records recommended that such files be transferred to NARS after 30 years, as provided in Title 44, U.S. Code, Section 2103. In discussions with NARS officials concerning this issue, it was resolved that the FBI might delay in transferring records that must be permanently retained to NARS for the use in the conduct of the regular current business of the FBI past the 30-year period recommended by NARS. It was further resolved that the FBI would document, on a classification-by-classification basis, that records to be permanently retained are being retained past the 30 year NARS recommended transfer date in order to assist in the conduct of the regular business of the FBI. NARS officials expressed the opinion that it would not be difficult to document extended retention past the 30-year transfer period recommended by NARS on this basis for certain classifications; however, NARS officials indicated that in other classifications, especially those classifications that are obsolete and those containing nonsensitive information, would be most difficult to justify the extended retention of this material by the FBI. In discussion with NARS officials, it was suggested that records designated for permanent retention in the following selected nonsensitive and obsolete classifications be transferred to NARS 30 years from the date of the last communication appearing in the file:

It is believed that the recommendations made by NARS officials are reasonable and that we should modify our proposed disposition schedules to reflect the transfer of this material as indicated above at 30 years instead of 50 years as originally set forth in our proposed disposition schedules. Naturally, before any such material was transferred to NARS, it would be thoroughly reviewed by Records Management Division personnel and personnel from other responsible FBIHQ divisions. Our disposition schedules must be modified prior to November 9, 1981, when this material must be submitted to the U.S. District Court, Washington, D. C., for consideration.




Subsequent to the indictments and issuance of search warrants, a large number of video tapes of copyrighted films were seized. A subsequent order was issued by United States District Court, Honolulu, upon completion of trial and sentencing, that the video tapes of copyrighted films be forfeited to the government and could be either destroyed or erased and the tapes made use of by law enforcement. Strike Force Attorney [redacted], Honolulu, is in agreement, and those video tapes which can be destroyed have been discussed with him.

It is requested that FBIHQ consult with representatives of the National Archives and Records Service (NARS) and determine if these video tapes may be destroyed or erased and utilized by Honolulu.
